San Leandro City Council, Residents and City Employees –

This week we shifted our minds momentarily away from the Shelter-In-Place health orders and onto heatwaves, wildfires, and potential PG&E Public Safety Power Shut Offs. It is imperative that our community prepares for the next potential natural disasters. Therefore, PG&E is hosting safety webinars on its Community Wildfire Safety Program and the steps the company is taking to reduce the impact of Public Safety Power Shutoff events on customers and communities. The webinars will feature a brief presentation and an opportunity for participants to ask questions and provide feedback.

The next webinar is scheduled for Wednesday, Aug. 19 from 5:30 to 7 p.m. Closed captioning will be available in English, Spanish, and Chinese. There are dial-in phone numbers for those who are unable to join online. Learn more by clicking [here](#).

Finally, a Spare the Air Alert has been extended through Sunday, August 23, due to elevated levels of particulate pollution in the Bay Area from numerous wildfires. Burning wood, manufactured fire logs or any other solid fuel is prohibited both indoors and outdoors. If the smell of smoke is present, protect your health by avoiding exposure. 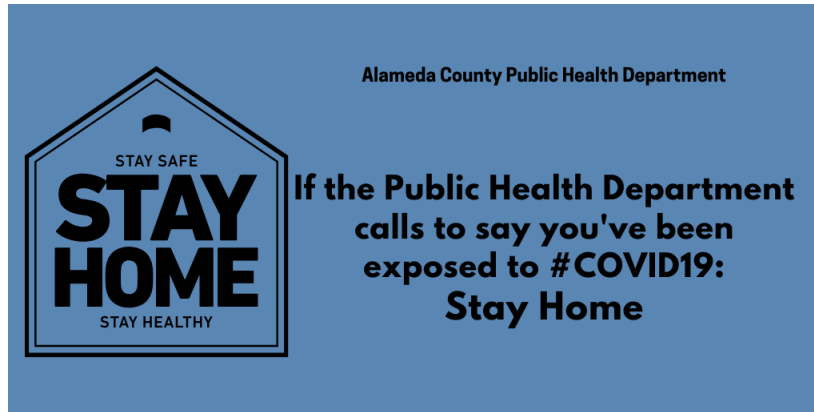

Testing conducted by OptumServe/LHI. No insurance is required. The City of San Leandro and Eden Health District have no information on scheduling or test results.

If you are contacted by the Public Health Department or otherwise become aware that you have been exposed to COVID-19, you must quarantine for 14 days. Stay home and, if possible, remain in a separate room from other non-exposed people and pets in your home and try to use a separate bathroom.



**When to Wear Face Coverings (From Alameda County Health Order – No. [20-13](#))**

A person does not need to wear a Face Covering when outdoors alone or with a member of their Social Bubble and they have a Face Covering visible and immediately ready to cover the nose and mouth (such as hanging around their neck) and nobody else (other a member of their own Social Bubble) is outdoors within 30 feet (10 yards) of them. It is recommended that people from the same household or living unit wear a Face Covering when outside, even if others are not nearby, any time others may appear without much notice.

For reference, 30 feet is around the length of two cars end-to-end. When people are approaching each other and likely ORDER OF THE HEALTH OFFICER No. 20-13 4 to pass in the coming seconds, they must put on their Face Coverings when they are within 30 feet. This 30-foot rule applies whether people are on the sidewalk, in a park, on a path or trail, or in any other outdoor area, and whether they are walking, running, biking, otherwise exercising, standing, or engaged in transportation such as using a motorcycle, skateboard, moped, or scooter. But the requirement to put on a Face Covering within 30 feet of others does not apply to people excepted from wearing a Face Covering under this Order due to age or medical condition or because they are eating or drinking or are stationary outside in a way that meets the requirements of Sections 3.e or 3.f below.

The 30 feet (10 yard) distance is used here to give people adequate time to put on a Face Covering before the distance closes and the people are within six feet of each other, which puts them at greater risk for transmission of the virus. As more activities are permitted, more people will be near each other without much advance warning, making wearing a Face Covering essential when people are within 30 feet.

### SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION

This report is for information only, and no action is required.

### BACKGROUND

In fall 2019, the City submitted an application and was selected to receive a Community Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Training (CPBST) workshop for the Williams Street corridor. The creation of a low-stress, bicycle and pedestrian-friendly corridor on Williams Street along the frontages of Woodrow Wilson Elementary School and John Muir Middle School is a top prioritized recommendation from the 2018 San Leandro Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan. These side-by-side campuses serve a combined student population of over 1,700, yet the percentage of those students walking, and bicycling is only 33% and 15%.

The CPBST program is a joint project of California Walks and UC Berkeley SafeTREC (Project Team). Funding for this program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA).

The CPBST program offers workshops to neighborhood residents and safety advocates on how to improve pedestrian bicycle safety and strengthen collaboration with local officials and City staff to make California communities safer and more pleasant to walk and bike. The CPBST Project Team have worked closely with our local Planning Committee, a core group of residents, community-based organizations, School and City staff, to plan a workshop which includes: walking/biking assessments, classroom style education on safety countermeasures, and a pedestrian/bicycle safety action planning activity. About two months after the workshop, the City will receive a workshop summary and recommendations report that can be used to support future pedestrian and bicycle safety efforts such as the study for the Crosstown Corridors Project.

### DISCUSSION

The CPBST workshop, the Williams Street Walking & Biking Safety Training, will be held on Saturday, August 15, 2020 from 11:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. The workshop will be held via Zoom conference and interested community members can register by email, phone or text at [alma@calwalks.org](mailto:alma@calwalks.org) or (714) 713-1450. Participants will conduct a virtual walking/biking safety assessment, plan for community programs and infrastructure projects and will learn more about safe walking and biking strategies.
