POST Body-Worn Camera Committee

- Chief Spagnoli is on a working committee for POST (Peace Officer Standards and Training) as a subject matter expert on Body Cameras to develop a statewide training video on the evaluation, implementation and use of this technology. The video is being designed to educate first responders and police executives on a Body Worn Camera program. The video will be available to all law enforcement agencies throughout California.
- Topic areas will include the benefits/challenges of cameras, legal considerations/privacy issues, policy development, auditing, implementation, costs, expectations, media and The Public Records Act. Police Departments across the state will learn about cameras from the experiences of the subject matter experts, prior to implementing their own system. SLPD continues to support best practices in law enforcement, and has become a statewide resource and model for other agencies to follow.

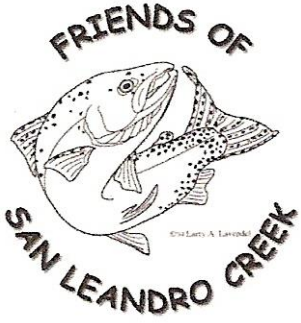
