Data sets are listed by program area (census or survey) and year. Site includes community profiles; data on age, education, income, and race; home values, ownership, and mortgage information; and information on foreign trade, governments, and housing starts.

It is divided into 50 titles that represent broad areas subject to Federal regulation. Each volume of the CFR is updated once each calendar year and is issued on a quarterly basis.
DOCS 328.73 UNI	Congressional Directory http://purl.access.gpo.gov/GPO/LPS194	The Directory presents short biographies of each member of the Senate and House, listed by state or district. It also lists committee memberships, terms of service, administrative assistants and/or secretaries, and room and telephone numbers. Additionally, it lists officials of the courts, military establishments, and other Federal departments and agencies, including D.C. government officials, governors of states and territories, foreign diplomats, and members of the press, radio, and television galleries.
DOCS	Congressional Record http://purl.access.gpo.gov/GPO/LPS1671	The Congressional Record is the official record of the proceedings and debates of the United States Congress. It is published daily when Congress is in session. The website contains Congressional Record volumes from 140 (1994) to the present. At the back of each daily issue is the <i>Daily Digest</i> , which summarizes the day's floor and committee activities.

It also describes the three chief branches of the Federal Government and their jurisdictions. In addition, it lays out the basic rights of citizens of the United States. The Constitution of the United States is the oldest Federal constitution in existence and was framed by a convention of delegates from twelve of the thirteen original states in Philadelphia in May 1787. The Constitution is the landmark legal document of the United States.

Also included is a complete set of state maps showing all counties, places of 25,000 or more population, and metropolitan areas.

The Economic Report of the President is transmitted to Congress no later than ten days after the submission of the Budget of the United States Government. Supplementary reports can be issued to the Congress which contain additional and/or revised recommendations.

Noting the lack of uniform compilations of messages and papers of the Presidents before this time, the Commission recommended the establishment of an official series in which Presidential writings, addresses, and remarks of a public nature could be made available.

It is a readable, easy to understand resource for the very complex Social Security programs and services.

It is divided by broad subjects into 50 titles and published by the Office of the Law Revision Counsel of the U.S. House of Representatives. Since 1926, the United States Code has been published every six years. In between editions, annual cumulative supplements are published in order to present the most current information.

It also includes information on quasi-official agencies, international organizations in which the United States participates as well as boards, commissions, and committees.

However, the materials collected here contain not just opinions, but the full text, from cover through index, of bound volumes 502 <i>et seq.</i> , including all of the opinions, orders, and other materials issued for the Court's 1991 Term and subsequent years.
DOCS 349.73	United States Statutes at Large http://purl.access.gpo.gov/GPO/LPS30184	This is the permanent collection of all laws and resolutions enacted during each session of Congress. The Statutes at Large is prepared and published by the Office of the Federal Register (OFR), National Archives and Records Administration (NARA). Every public and private law passed by Congress is published in the Statutes at Large by the date it was enacted into law.
